# 46 – Talk and Hands-On Demonstration: Burnished Gold – How to Gild the Eighteenth-Century Way

Mark Ossowski Maplethorpe Hall

Some of the most beautiful carved wooden objects ever made were made in the eighteenth century; and many of the mirror and picture frames, side, centre and console tables were gilded. Most high end items were done using the water-gilding process while others were done 'in oyl'. What is the difference? How was it done? What were the materials used? Do you know your rabbit-skin glue from your badger's hair brush or dog's claw burnishing tool? (Session not necessarily recommended for those of a sensitive disposition.) Mark Ossowski was born into a family of gilders, restorers and antiques dealers. He will show you the materials used in the eighteenth century and demonstrate the process. Those with a steady hand may even be able to have a go themselves provided they are not shy of handling 22t gold leaf.

# 87 – Presentation and Demonstration: Dalmatia – a destination of the European Grand Tour in the 18th and the 19th century – chronogeographical database presentation

The multi-disciplinary research project of the Institute of Art History, supported by the Croatian Science Foundation, brings together a team of theorists in the fields of comparative literature, architectural and art history, history and architecture. The overall aim of the project is to provide greater insight into the influence of the region on the development of European Neoclassicism and Romanticism; analyse its position between the western and eastern itineraries of the Grand Tour, and provide a more nuanced cultural portrayal of Dalmatia of that period. # 99 - Workshop: Staging and Directing Revivals - Collective performance practices in eighteenth-century France

This workshop will look at revivals and performance practices in eighteenth-century France. Based on primary sources such as prompter books, annotated printed books and roles, it will examine how actors moved on stage and how staging interacted with and depended on space and sets, but also dialogues. It will challenge Dene Barnett's statements on the actor's positions (depending, according to him, on the character's rank or gender), and discuss Tiffany Stern's views on rehearsals practices during the period. It will practically show that the success of a comedy (which usually included complex stage effects and often many characters on stage), required from actors to rehearse together regularly —the idea of lone actors working on their own being very questionable. This workshop will give a better understanding of collective directing during the period and explain why the Comédie-Française was praised and well-known for its ensemble (i.e. good coordination and synchronization between actors).
